News from the EFB

The European Fund for the Balkans (EFB) and the Institute for Democratic Engagement Southeast Europe (IDESE) are organizing the "Engaged Democracy Convention vol.2 Engage, Inspire, Empower!", which will take place on May 17 to 20, 2023, in Pristina, Kosovo. The first Engaged Democracy Convention 2021 in Belgrade under the slogan "Engage, Inspire, Empower!" was a starting point in creating a space of trust for sharing experiences, and good practices and for establishing the Engaged Democracy Initiative (EDI) network. The "Engaged Democracy Convention vol.2" in Pristina will take the network a step further: it will aim towards creating and effectively connecting local-level needs and activities on a regional level.



The main goal of the second EDI Convention is to gather members of the EDI network in one place to continue and deepen the work from the last Convention and plan the future activities.

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2nd Annual Event, Skopje, North Macedonia

The meeting was an opportunity to discuss the various possibilities to learn and empower the Network.



EFB Community training – Think and act as a European

The European Fund for the Balkans in cooperation with the European House (Hungary) organized a medium-scale EFB Community Training Programme in 2013, which was held both in Hungary and Slovakia. The priority of this training programme was to reach the other side and the broader European context, by thinking and acting in a European manner.




The project brought together 15 community members from the 7 Western Balkan countries including Croatia by treating them as EU citizens on an equal footing and on a partnership basis into the current mainstream of European policy-making processes. Participants were introduced to cross-border cooperation projects, EU-funded initiatives, and platforms through a series of focused training and practical field visits.

My EFB story

As a part of the Fellowship Program for Government Officials 2017/18, my host institution was the Office of the Government of Republic of Slovenia for Legislation. Prior applying for the program, my home institution was at the beginning of developing an information system for alignment of the national legislation with the EU acquis as one of the main criteria for a country which aim to join the European union. So, the general goal of creating an information system was to support the European integration process and to digitalize the process of alignment of legislation.

This was the main reason for me to choose this Office for my fellowship. My main goal was to become familiar with the Legal Information System of the Republic of Slovenia (PIS). It is important to point out, that during my fellowship, the Office was in the phase of developing a new, more effective and user-friendly applications called MOPED and it was the perfect moment for my fellowship program. I had the opportunity to work directly in the existing PIS system, see how the new information system is being developed, and test its functionalities.



Upon my return home, the first step was to present the program of my internship to my colleagues, and in detail the way PIS works, as well as the application MOPED. This was a real challenge because my task was to present the functionalities of both applications which I worked on for almost three months, through a PowerPoint presentation.

Soon after that, my home institution established a special team responsible for the preparation of an information system for alignment. Thanks to the knowledge and information I gained during my fellowship, I was a part of this team.

After two years of preparing and developing the system, my home institution, the Directorate for European Integration, with the support of Sweden, presented on 14 February 2023 the first **Legal Information System – LIS**. The established IT system will improve efficiency and accelerate the process by reducing the time needed for the preparation of alignment instruments (table of concordance), optimization of the process verification and confirmation of compliance, optimization of terminology and translation process, open access to data on alignment which will increase the transparency of the process.

Considering that five years have passed since my fellowship, I must emphasize that the experience and knowledge I gained by participating in the program contributed to the development of a very important IT system for my country in the European Union accession process.
